Here is an example of a SMART goal using the Common Core Standards for a kindergarten student (CCSS.ELA-Literacy.SL.K.5). GOAL: By June 2016, during speaking and listening tasks the student will independently be able to open/close containers that hold ELA supplies 9 out of 10 trials to create drawings or visual displays when presenting knowledge and ideas.

What an occupational therapy session looks like. OTs use "occupations" or activities as both means and ends to therapy, according to Chrysalyka Perez, or Teacher Lyka, an OT from Little Big Steps Pediatric Therapy Clinic. They use play activities, sensory integration, behavioral modification, and language facilitation to help a child develop the occupational skills needed for everyday life.

The following were my original sensory goals (rescued by the wayback machine), and you can see that they don't fit those formats. -pt. will tolerate 1 "unpleasant" stimulus per session -pt. to attend to seated activity for 10 minutes following sensory activity

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Writing S.M.A.R.T. IEP goals will not only make your job easier in the long run but it will help to better assist the team in monitoring child progress, needs, and help to determine the continued need for occupational therapy.
